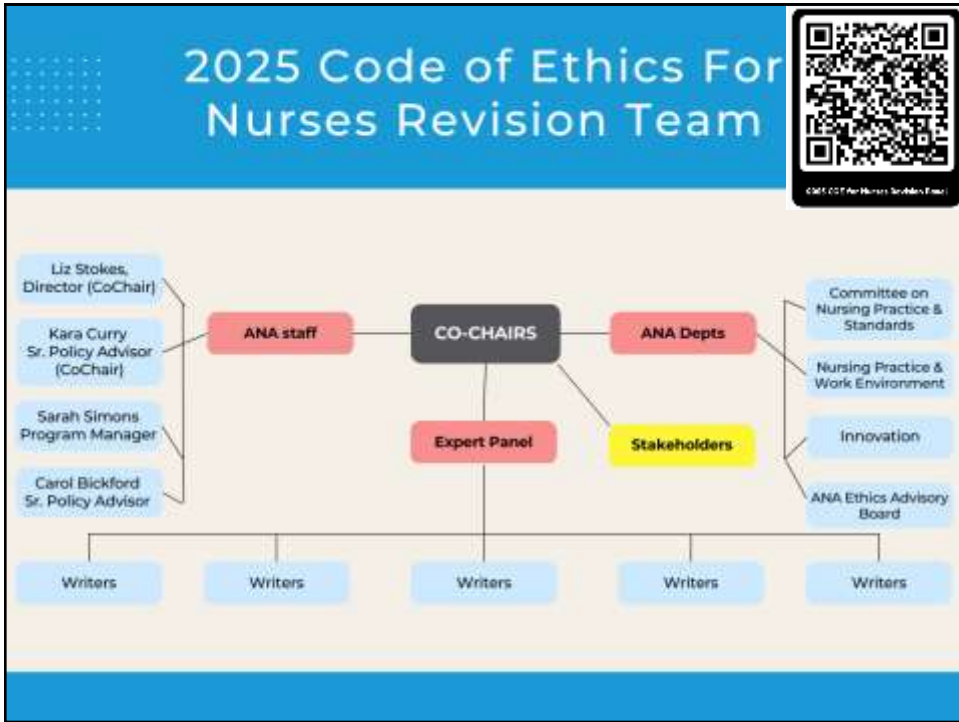
Purpose & Goals

- Building off the current Code of Ethics for Nurses, the Expert Panel will develop ethical guidance on the values and ideals of the profession and identify ethical challenges affecting the health and well-being of the populations we serve, including individual nurses, and the nursing profession.
- The ANA Code Re'Vision Panel will work collaboratively to share ethical issues relevant to nursing, priorities, and goals, to develop a robust Code of Ethics for Nurses that promises to strengthen, foster, and inspire ethical action in others.

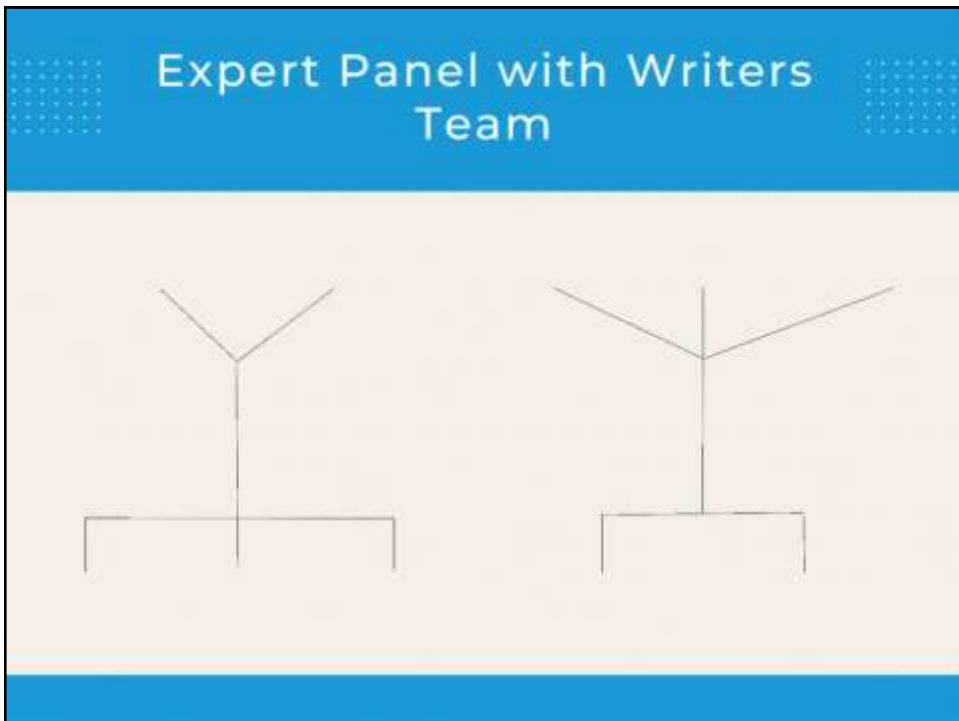
