# Building a Crosswalk: Inclusive Conversations with Academia and Clinical Partners



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### **Problem Statement and Goals**

As the number of patients with health disparities and health related social needs increase, student nurses must be prepared to care for these patients. Preparation for caring for diverse populations should be integrated into the course curriculums and practiced during training in the health care settings. Collaboration with academia and clinical partners is necessary when curriculums and organizational training development is planned and implemented. The Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) Advisory Group would provide a forum for academia and clinical practice partners to collaborate and achieve the following goals:

- Gain insight into current DEI trainings in both the academia and clinical settings
- Address current DEI training needs to meet the academic curriculum and practice partners accreditation and regulatory expectations
- Create a seamless transition to practice
- Improve the quality-of-care delivery and positively impact patient outcomes.

- Review of existing DEI content in course curriculums
- Review of clinical organization DEI educational offerings and requirements
- Integration of clinical organization training into student orientation

## Implementation Process

Establish a Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) Advisory group that will include students, faculty and corporate DEI leaders of two of the largest health care organizations in the region. The Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Advisory group will all access to shared knowledge.

Meetings were scheduled with DEI corporate leader representatives from each health care system. The proposal to establish the DEI Advisory group was presented and accepted by both organizations. Additional meeting dates have been set to continue discussions related to current DEI training included in the course curriculums and trainings, expectations and requirements in the health care organizations.

The inaugural DEI Advisory group meeting date has been planned. The meeting will take place on Thursday, September 26, 2024 @ 3:00 p.m. CST.

During the DEI Advisory meetings, the academic and clinical partners will collaborate to develop topics of discussions that will assist in developing a healthcare workforce that can address current and emerging needs for improving health equity and access.

Mutual goals will be established to plan and develop trainings that will provide seamless transition to practice and ensure that the curriculum aligns with current practices and expectations in the health care settings.
