PROBLEM INTRODUCTION

- 1.6 million people in the united states identify as transgender (CDC, 2022)
- Lower rates of healthcare seeking behaviors among individuals who identify as transgender due to the stigma conveyed when accessing the healthcare system
- There is a lack of LGBTQ specific knowledge by medical providers
- Inadequate training and implicit bias of nursing and healthcare providers are contributing factors

To increase awareness and provide education of the primary healthcare needs of individuals who identify as transgender in nursing curricula.



GOALS

- Increase nursing student knowledge of individuals who identify as Transgender and gender affirming care.
- Enhance confidence and empower nursing students to provide care to individuals who identify as transgender
- Raising awareness of health challenges and obstacles to healthcare experienced by those who identify as transgender.
- Promote advocacy and enhancing positive patient experiences.

FUTURE PLAN

- Fall 2024 & Spring 2025 –Leadership and Management Practicum Course
- 32 students/TBA
- Simulation will be conducted by clinical faculty in conjunction with simulation team.
- Learners will receive a copy of the simulation in advance
- Pre- Sim Prep Questions will be completed and submitted before simulation begins
- Participants will complete Pre-Test before simulation begins
- Participants will complete simulation
- Simulation team/Faculty will debrief with students
- Simulation Post test

IMPACT ON PRACTICE

To increase awareness and education in the care of this special population and decrease the barriers in health care that may lead to health care disparities

Providing supportive tools for student nurses to provide, professional culturally sensitive care to transgender patients
